ABOUT THE COMPANY

RIBEIRO D.O

The 'Ribeiro' D.O. is recognised since 1.932. However in as early as 1.594, municipal ordinances regulated the production of wine.

The region is 2.800 hectares wide and is located in South of Galicia on the banks of rivers Miño, Avia and Arnoia.

Due to its privileged location, the 'Ribeiro' is protected by natural barriers from subatlantic storms and enjoys mild temperatures, optimal conditions for vine growing. In this soil of granitic origin are produced some of the best wines in Spain.

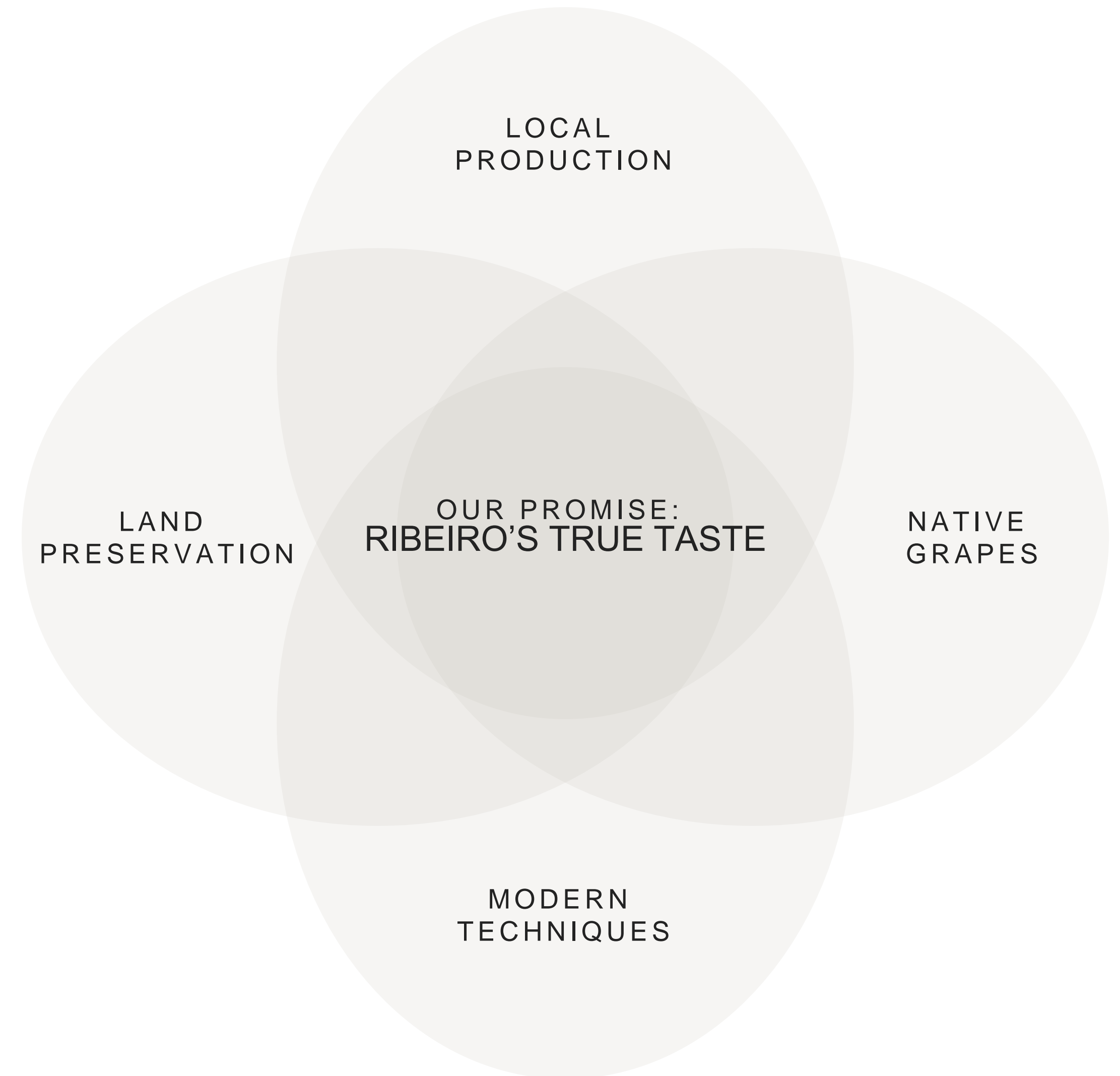

FACT SHEET

- The company was founded in 1998.
- It changed its name to Priorato de Razamonde this year.
- The family business can be traced back to the beginning of the 20th century.
- The company has been selling its wine under the brand Alter since the 2012 vintage.
- In 2014, it acquired the estate 'A Granxa' in Razamonde, with buildings from the 17th century for the winery and the main office.
- It is now a rural estate of 28 hectares of land, of which 24 are planted with vines.
- Wines are planted in trellis with a planting pattern (2,3x1,1 m) that allows mechanical cultivation.
- 90% of production are white grapes (Treixadura, Godello and Loureira) and 10% are red (Sausón and Godello).
- In 2015, 160.000kg of grapes were harvested.

Priorato de Razamonde, de Viña da Cal, primer premio de la Feira do Ribeiro

Cuñas Davía gana el galardón de cosecheros en vinos blancos

La Feira do Viño do Ribeiro procedió a la entrega de los premios de la cata popular del certamen. En la categoría de Vinos Blancos de Bodegas ha resultado galardonado como mejor vino Priorato de Razamonde 2015, de Viña da Cal. En la categoría Vinos Blancos de Cosecheros el ganador del primer premio fue Cuñas Davía 2015, de Adegas Valdavía. El vino Pazos de Albor 2015, de Mónica Albor López, ha recibido el segundo premio. El tercero ha recibido en el vino Sameirás 2015, de Antonio Calde Gullín.

En la categoría de Vinos Tintos, el primer premio fue para Viña do Campo 2014, de Bodegas Docampo; el segundo ha recaído en Cuñas Davía 2014, de Adegas Valdavía; y el tercero fue para Joaquín Vázquez 2015, de Joaquín Vázquez Martínez.

El presidente del Consello Regulador do Ribeiro, Felicísimo Pereira, destacó la importancia de estos premios, "pues es el público el que los otorga. El consumidor reconoce y traslada en estos premios sus preferencias y gustos, por lo que no cabe más que resaltar su valor".

La Feira do Viño do Ribeiro reconoció como Mejor Catador de Vinos Tintos a Noemí Penela, de Castelo de Miño; en la categoría de Mejor Catador de Vinos Blancos de Cosecheros, el ganador fue Marcos Gutiérrez, vecino de Vigo; y como Mejor Catador de Vinos Blancos de Bodega, el galardonado fue Roberto Taibo, de Ribadavia. Estos premios se otorgan a las personas que más se acercan a los resultados finales de los vinos premiados en cada una de las categorías.

50 best white wines and fizz

White wines can be just as wonderful in winter as red wines. My guide today has a mouthwatering Gascon party white for only a fiver — snap it up quickly because these brilliant bargain bottles in Tesco won't hang around for long. If you're looking for a fantastic bottle of chardonnay, try the 2016 Sous Le Soleil du Midi from Waitrose for only £5.99.

There are a fair few bottles on my list from Aldi and Lidl, but if you're too snooty to shop at the German discount stores, there are plenty of cheap wines elsewhere. Morrisons has a wonderful, buttery white burgundy from a leading Maconnais co-op for £7. Sainsbury's has an excellent Kiri sauvignon blanc with passion fruit and lemon grass for £7.25, as well as a great bottle of prosecco for a steal at just £7.50 — last year the same bottle would have set you back a tenner.

There is lots of zingy chablis and sancerre to go with your traditional smoked salmon starter on Christmas Day, including an exotic, fiery, dry tokaji from one of Hungary's top producers, on offer for a knockdown £8 a pop from Sainsbury's. This would complement gyoias perfectly.

Not everyone wants red wine to go with their turkey, but it's tricky to find a white wine that works with the rich flavours of this meat. I've got a couple of options here, but my top Christmas lunch white is the South African Stellenbosch Chardonnay at £10 from Booths — it's strong enough to cope with turkey and all the trimmings.

If you like to sample wine from more unusual regions, try the Okto dry white wine from Crete — a fashionable aperitif — or there's a wine from the Alps called Altesse Roussette du Bugay that is great with pâté.

Priorato de Razamonde se estrena con premio

Viña da Cal elabora este vino en el mismo viñedo que hace casi cien años utilizó Daniel Vázquez Gullás para producir su "Gran Champagne"

Hace un año la bodega Viña da Cal ocupaba esta misma página porque su vino blanco Alter había ganado el primer premio al mejor blanco de colleiteiro en la cata popular de la 52 FERIA del Vino del Ribeiro. En los doce meses transcurridos, trasladaron sus instalaciones a la otra orilla del Miño, desde Castelo de Miño a Cenlle y han traspasado la barrera de los 60.000 litros, por lo que han dejado de ser colleiteiros para convertirse en bodega. El incremento vino dado por la incorporación de una nueva finca, que es la que le da el nombre al vino del que hablamos hoy: Priorato de Razamonde. Gracias a ella ahora suman 24 hectáreas en plena producción, lo que les permite disponer en la cosecha de 2015 de 60.000 litros de vino: 40.000 botellas de Alter blanco, 25.000 de tinto y 6.000 botellas de Priorato de Razamonde, un monovarietal de Treixadura que es al mismo tiempo un vino de finca. Su presentación en sociedad tuvo lugar en la última feria del vino del Ribeiro; y fue llegar y triunfar, porque la cata popular lo eligió como el mejor blanco de bodega de la cosecha de 2015, otorgándole así a Viña da Cal un importante espaldarazo en su estreno como bodega.

Galician whites

Ribeiro and Valdeorras, two small DOs in Spain's far northwest, are punching above their weight with characterful white wines, says Pedro Ballesteros Torres MW



and highly appreciated in the UK. Those wines were not Albariño but a blend of grape varieties cultivated further inland, in the Ribeiro region. Such was the fame of those wines that in 1579 the local government of Ribadavia introduced a law to protect the indication of origin and the accepted winemaking practices, to prevent fraud. Ribeiro was arguably the first appellation of origin.

Ribeiro wines' privileged situation lasted until the second half of the 19th century, when the 'American pests', as they were known - oidium (powdery mildew), peronospora (downy mildew) and finally phylloxera - ravaged the vineyards. New grafted vines were not well adapted to Ribeiro terroirs and quality declined. Besides, Spain's weak economic situation and the massive emigration of Galicians within Europe and to America were the coup de grâce for Ribeiro. Until now.

Back to its roots

The new Ribeiro is rediscovering its indigenous grape varieties: Treixadura, Loureiro, Godello, Torrontés, Lado... and more. It is also once again exploiting its unique terroir, close to the Atlantic Ocean but protected from it by mountains (making it much less humid than Rias Baixas, with shallow granite soils providing purity), and centuries of tradition in the production of fine wine.

The range of qualities and styles is quite broad in Ribeiro. The best examples offer purity of fruit, with typical green leaf aromas, laurel and mint, and brioche for those with lees contact. On the palate they tend to be quite moderate in alcohol - 12.5% to 13% alcohol - fresh, expressive and different. With few exceptions, they are best drunk within five years of harvest.

Our second appellation in this selection, Valdeorras, has a different story. Further east again, it nestles against the border with León and has a remarkably continental climate. It owes its fame to its flagship white grape variety Godello, and to a few heroes who understood and exploited its potential.

Valdeorras is one of the rare cases in which a public initiative results in the rebirth of a fine wine region. In the late 1970s, a government official, Horacio Fernández, single-handedly launched a public research project, smartly called Revival, to recover old Godello plant material. Then he created his own winery, Godelval, to go from research to market. Some years later, international recognition came with Rafael Palacios who, with his As Sortes/O Soro series, has done for Spanish white wines something equivalent to what his brother Alvaro (Decanter's Man of the Year in 2010) did for red wines.

The best Godello wines from Valdeorras are comparable to top Burgundy: solidly built but delicate, quite terroir-sensitive, complex and racy, and very long. They benefit from lees contact and bâtonnage (lees stirring), and need some bottle ageing to acquire their best expression. They are likely to become collectable: Spanish new wave classics. You heard it here first!
